#### China launches land exploration satellite

China on Sunday launched a land exploration satellite into a pre-set orbit, designed for remote sensing exploration of land resources. The satellite was launched on a Long March-2D rocket from the Jiuquan Satellite Launch Centre in China's northern Gobi Desert at 12.11 p.m., state-run Xinhua reported. PTI

Mumbai terror attack mastermind Hafiz Saeed has confirmed on Saturday that his organisation Jamaat-ud-Dawah will contest the 2018 general elections in Pakistan under the banner of the Milli Muslim League, which is vet to be registered with the Election Commission.

"The Milli Muslim League (MML) is planning to contest next year's general elections," said Saeed, who has been designated a 'terrorist' by both the United Nations and the United States.

The JuD chief walked free on November 24 after the Pakistan government decided against detaining him further in any other case. He was under detention since January this year.

The MML had contested a bypoll in September for NA-120, a National Assembly seat that had fallen vacant following disqualification of former Prime Minister Na-

Mr. Sharif's wife Kulsoom Nawaz won that seat.

Sheikh Yaqub, MML candidate, had secured 6,000 votes. Yaqub was placed in 2012 on a U.S. Treasury sanctions list of those designated as leaders of terrorist organisations.

### On Kashmir

Vowing to continue supporting the Kashmiris fighting the Indian forces, Saeed said that his detention in Pakistan and arrest of Hurriyat leaders in India was part of international agenda.

"I want to tell Pakistan that backchannel diplomacy only caused harm to the Kashmir cause," he alleged on Saturday.

# 'Didn't ask Comey to drop probe'

Trump refutes Comey's claim on Flynn investigation; President had fired former FBI head in May

U.S. President Donald Trump denied on Sunday having asked then FBI director James Comey to stop investigating ex-National Security Adviser Michael Flynn, as the Russia meddling probe darkened what would otherwise have been a victorious week for the President.

Mr. Trump appeared to be backtracking furiously from a tweet on Saturday that deepened suspicions that he engaged in obstruction of justice - an impeachable offence - in the Russia scandal haunting his presidency.

In that Twitter post, Mr. Trump said he had fired Flynn in February for lying not just to the Vice President but also to Mr. Comey's FBI, which was probing Flynn over his pre-inauguration contacts with the Russian Amabout sanctions imposed by Barack Obama against Russia.

Mr. Comey has testified under oath to lawmakers that a day after firing Flynn, Mr. Trump asked him to drop the Flynn probe.

### **Obstruction of justice?**

If Mr. Comey is to be believed, the Saturday tweet suggests Mr. Trump asked the FBI to lay off someone in his administration that Mr. Trump now acknowledges he knew had committed a felony – lying to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

But on Sunday, Mr. Trump insisted, "I never asked Comey to stop investigating Flynn. Just more Fake News covering another Comey lie!" Mr. Trump fired Comey in May and has said he did so with the Russia probe in mind.

Schiff, the ranking Democrat on the House Intelligence committee, said Sunday that suspicions of obstruction of justice by Mr. Trump are growing. In an ominous turn for the president, Flynn on Friday pleaded guilty to lying to the FBI and pledged to cooperate with special counsel Robert Mueller.

White House officials told The New York Times that in his tweet on Saturday Mr. Trump was only referencing Flynn's guilty plea for lying to the FBI about his conversations with then Russian Ambassador Sergey Kislyak.

Mr. Trump's personal lawyer John Dowd told ABC News that he had drafted the tweet and had done so in a "sloppy" manner.

Mr. Mueller's focus goes beyond possible collusion with Russia to business dealings and whether Mr. Trump himself tried to thwart the in-

vestigation. Mr. Trump also expressed anger Sunday over word that a senior FBI counterintelligence official, Peter Strzok, was removed from the Russia investigation over the summer for sending text messages critical of Trump. Mr. Strzok had also worked on the probe into Hillary Clinton's use of a private email server while serving as secretary of state.

## **ABC** suspends reporter

Also, ABC News said on Saturday it had suspended Brian Ross, its chief investigative correspondent, over an error in his reporting about Flynn. ABC News had reported that Flynn, citing a confidant, was prepared to testify that Mr. Trump directed him to make contact with Russians when he was a presidential candidate.

It later later issued a correction that the source clarified that Mr. Trump had assigned Flynn and a "small circle of senior advisers" to find ways to improve relations with Russia and other hotspots during the presidential transition.

# U.S. pulls out of UN's pact on migration

The administration of President Donald Trump has withdrawn the United States from a United Nations pact to improve the handling of migrant and refugee situations, deeming it "inconsistent" with its policies, the U.S. mission to the global body announced on Saturday.

"Today, the U.S. Mission to the United Nations informed the UN Secretary-General that the United States is ending its participation in the Global Compact on Migration," the Americans said in a

statement. In September 2016, the UN General Assembly adopted a nonbinding political declaration, the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants, pledging to uphold the rights of refugees, help them resettle and ensure they have access to education. Ambassador Nikki Haley

said the country would continue its "generosity" in supporting migrants and refugees around the world, but that "our decisions on immigration policies must always be made by Americans and Americans alone".

# Tillerson denies reports of possible ouster

U.S. Secretary of State Rex Tillerson on Saturday denied that he was leaving his post to be replaced by CIA Director Mike Pompeo.

Asked if there was any truth to the multiple reports about him this week, Mr. Tillerson told Reuters: "None."

"People need to get better sources," he said in a brief interview at the State Department ahead of a dinner to celebrate the recipients of this year's **Kennedy Center Honors** awards. Mr. Tillerson said he hoped to be at the same reception a year from now. "I'm going to be here as long as I can be effective

# Police called in U.S. school after student says 'Allah'

U.S. elementary school student Mohammad Suleiman, 6, who was born with Down syndrome, was feared as a terrorist by his teacher after he kept repeating 'Allah' and 'boom' in his classroom, a media report said.

Suleiman's father said a substitute teacher at the C.I. Harris Elementary School, which is located in Pearland, near Houston, made the call. Calling it "discrimination", the father added that his son doesn't speak at all and has the mental capacity of a one-year-old, The reported. Independent "They claim that he's a terrorist. This is so stupid... It's not implied discrimination, it's a hundred per cent discrimination," he said.

The Pearland Police Department said it has concluded its investigation and found no further action was needed. However, the region's Child Protective Services department said its investigation is ongoing.

education there. We wanted to enroll my brother for college but we were asked to give lots of money to the government servants there, and we couldn't afford it," she savs.

Further, she adds, the people are not allowed to watch or listen to any foreign broadcast. "We used to smuggle and watch Chinese sitcoms. In the evening, families would close all doors and windows and dim the lights to watch this. If the administration found out, they would deport the violators to the countryside, where life is

even more miserable." According to the Korean Institute for National

Unification in South Korea, every year, over 2000 refugees enter its borders from the North. Government data show that at present over 30,000 refugees live in the South. The figure has, however, come down during the Kim Jong-un regime, because of stricter border security

rules. The Korea Hana Foundation, an organisation for refugees, says that 70% of the refugees out of the total are women, possibly due to the human trafficking network that preys on the desperation of women to get out of North Korea.

"Life there is difficult for both men and women. But laws," said Jin Soo (name changed), a 20-year-old refugee who has been living in Seoul since 2012. He is now studying international politics here under the government's rehabilitation programme. Restrictions at home Narrating the ordeal for

women do have a tougher life compared to men

because of the stringent

women back home, 21-yearold Mi Na (name changed), says that she was not allowed to grow her hair, wear short skirts or pants. "You could not even colour it," she says.

She adds that in school textbooks she had read about the "evil South Korean regime", but it was after coming here that she realised the brainwashing done by the regime, "We were told that they want to destroy North Korea and conquer the country for they have no resources of their own." These students hope to

build a better life for themselves and at the same time wish for a united Korea to be able to finally meet their families. (Names changed to protect identities)
